#### **Three-Year Goal Statement:**

State and territorial health agencies are aware of and taking meaningful action towards creating a governmental public health system that reflects an ideal state

#### **OBJECTIVES:**

- Advocate for sustainable policies and funding 1.1 that address health disparities and advances health equity initiatives.
- Support state and territorial health agency 1.2 capacity to implement evidence-based, sustainable policies and strategies that address the root causes of disparities and advance health and racial equity.
- Contribute to the evidence base of effective 1.3 intervention strategies that are inclusive of historically marginalized populations.
- Develop trainings and other resources that 1.4 increase state and territorial health official capacity to advance diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives.

## **Our Strategic Priorities**



### **Workforce Development**

A diverse state and territorial public health workforce that is engaged, well-resourced, well-trained, and connected to the communities it serves.

#### **Three-Year Goal Statement:**

The public health workforce is revitalized, sustainably rebuilt, and effectively prepared to meet current and emerging public health needs.

#### **OBJECTIVES:**

- Advocate for sustainable, flexible federal funding for workforce development.
- Build capacity in state and territorial health agencies to recruit and retain qualified candidates who reflect the diversity of their communities.
- 2.3 Enhance the foundational capabilities and strategic skills of state and territorial health agency leaders to lead public health transformation and systems improvement.







## Sustainable Infrastructure Improvements

State and territorial health agencies have sufficient, predictable, flexible capabilities, resources, and authorities to effectively protect and promote the health of their communities.

#### Three-Year Goal Statement:

ASTHO has supported state and territorial health officials to strategically invest current funding towards making sustainable improvements in capacity, capability, authority, and equity.

#### **OBJECTIVES:**

- Advocate for a predictable, multi-year disease-agnostic, public health infrastructure fund.
- 3.2 Advance the development of model state and territorial public health systems in conjunction with state and territorial health agencies and partners.
- 3.3 Improve state and territorial health agencies' strategic and administrative readiness to leverage available funding and support sustainable infrastructure improvements.
- Enhance state and territorial health officials' capability to respond to attempts to undermine public health authority and weaken or repeal laws and regulations that undermine the public's health.

## Data Modernization & Interoperability

A state and territorial public health system supported by an enterprise-level data infrastructure in which public health data systems are interoperable, secure, and supported by a well-trained workforce.

#### **Three-Year Goal Statement:**

ASTHO and state and territorial health agencies have made meaningful progress towards the development of an enterprise-level public health data infrastructure in which data systems are interoperable, secure, and sustainable.

#### **OBJECTIVES:**

- 4.1 Advocate for sustained flexible funding to support data modernization initiatives.
- Develop and implement a state and territorial public health data infrastructure framework that guides data modernization and interoperability.
- 4.3 Cultivate innovative public-private partnerships between public health and the technology sectors to foster leading-edge, transformative solutions for public health response and practice.
- 4.4 Increase state and territorial health agency capacity to integrate advances in informatics and respond to related workforce development needs.





## **Evidence-Based and Promising Public Health Practices**

State and territorial health agencies are implementing evidence-based public health policies and programs in their jurisdictions that are achieving tangible improvement in public health outcomes across all programs and populations.

#### **Three-Year Goal Statement:**

State and territorial health agency implementation of focused, effective, and equitable intervention policies, programs, and practices to improve public health has increased across the governmental public health system.
